ABOUT US

The Mackay Community Foundation provides an opportunity for individuals, families, and businesses to make donations to support those in need in the region, both now and in the future. Subject to any legal requirements for minimum annual distributions, donations are retained as capital by The Foundation to build a perpetual and sustainable fund for philanthropic purposes. The income earned from the capital is used to make community grants.

The Mackay Community Foundation conducts an annual grant program and encourages appropriate not for profit organisations in the region to apply for grants for charitable projects that fit within the aims of The Foundation.

The Foundation has been endorsed by the Australian Tax Office as a charity and by the Queensland Office of Fair Trading as fundraising for a charitable purpose. Donations to The Foundation are tax deductible and The Foundation is exempt from tax.

The Foundation is governed by a volunteer Board of Directors, with a wide range of skills, experience and an extensive knowledge of the region's community.

OUR HISTORY

The concept for The Mackay Community Foundation began with our founder Scott Alman in 2002. Scott, a partner in a local investment advisory firm was discussing the story below and thought about the impact on the needy if someone had put away some money for Mackay 100 years ago.

In 1626, Peter Miniut purchased Manhattan Island from the Algonquin tribe of Indians for trinkets worth about \$24. Given the price of real estate in Manhattan today, we could argue that the Indians were swindled. However let's assume that the Indians invested the \$24 in a bank account returning 6% per year compounded annually.

In 2005 after 379 years the investment would be worth \$66 Billion

The key founding principal was to give the Mackay Community the opportunity to 'Give Where You Live'. Secondly that money donated would be invested, and together with the growth, the capital would be retained in perpetuity. Each year the growing income is to be given away to community groups, and projects, to assist those in need in our community.

Scott then set about inspiring other key business and community leaders to join the board of the foundation. The founding board members were; Solicitor Andrew Coates, Accountant Wayne James and Financial Planner Stephen Lowry, with Scott Alman as the chair. Since the beginning the sitting Mayor of Mackay has also held a position on the board.

AT A GLANCE

Since our establishment in 2003 we have distributed 56 grants to local community groups and charities since inception.

The Mackay Community Foundation is a member of Australian Community Philanthropy and is one of 36 community foundations across Australia, linked by similar values, ethics and intent and each playing a vital role in their own community providing grassroots support at a local level.

The Mackay Community Foundation provides support to local community groups and charities in the Mackay region north to Proserpine and Airlie Beach, west to Moranbah, Dysart and Clermont and south to Sarina which is an area encompassing a population of approximately 150,000 people.

The Mackay Community Foundation managed the 2008 Mackay Flood Appeal, upon request of the then Mackay City Council, raising \$564,566.13 that was distributed directly to Mackay people impacted by this natural disaster.

The Mackay Community Foundation works extremely hard to ensure administrative expenses are kept to a minimum and where possible source donated services and support. Fifteen percent of each dollar donated to the Foundation is directed to the administration account to assist with the costs associated with enabling the Foundation to deliver its mission:

GRANTS COMMITTEE REPORT 2016

It has been a year of change of focus in the support that we provide through our Mackay Community Foundation (MCF) Grants program with, for the first time, offering an opportunity for funding more substantial projects. In the past, our grants have funded small equipment items or small individual programs, however in 2016 we encouraged projects that could demonstrate longer term outcomes, had a broader coverage, and supported local businesses.

Following our decision in 2015 to increase the Grant amounts, this year we offered grants in the \$10,000-\$30,000 range to allow an organisation to look at actual program development and capacity building within their target groups, as well as programs to address long term disadvantage.

For the first time in the Mackay Community Foundation's history, the Board decided to make available a significant one-off grant of \$30,000 to support a pilot program over a 12 month period for an innovative project that would fill a recognised gap in the Mackay Community.

This year, while there were successful applications for equipment, we also had several program based projects successfully funded and all grants address identified barriers faced by those who are disadvantaged.

The MCF Grants program provides funds to help, aid, provide relief or support persons in distress in Mackay and surrounding districts. We do this by working with eligible organisations that primarily offer community education, care services, housing or personal support services, through a grant application process. In 2016, MCF provided a total of \$44,300 to our successful organisations who come from the youth, family support, seniors, homelessness and general community support sectors.

GRANTS

Anglicare Nth Qld (Mackay)

Anglicare Nth Qld, Mackay branch, provides without discrimination, a range of affordable and accessible counselling and personal support services including emergency relief, to families and individuals. This year MCF provided Anglicare in Mackay with \$7,500 for their Emergency Care program to enable them to continue to deliver their much needed services in our Mackay community.

HTM Community Transport Inc.

HTM provides a low cost transport service for people who are Frail Aged or who have a permanent disability, to enable them to attend medical appointments and social activities, thus contributing to improved general wellbeing. As a result of their health, these people are no longer able to drive or are not able to access public transport. While HTM receives some Government funding they rely on volunteer drivers.

HTM's successful application in 2016 was for \$6,000 to fund the "HTM Happy Hour" program providing clients with a weekly social outing which includes a drive to a surprise destination for a meal & social interaction with others. This promotes independence & helps prevent social isolation.

Mackay Children's Contact Service

The MCCS provides two main services to the families of Mackay and surrounding districts. They offer changeovers of children between separated parents that are in conflict with each other. The MCCS ensures that the children are not exposed to any of their parent's conflict and that the changeover occurs in a child-focused, child-friendly and calm environment.

MCCS also provides supervised visits between children and their parent/s or significant others, in a safe and child friendly environment.

This year MCF provided \$2,300 to MCCS to purchase new toys and play equipment for use by families that come to the MCCS for supervised contact visits. Each month approximately 200 children pass through the doors of the MCCS. And the new toys will benefit these children by having the opportunity to develop positive family relationships through play based interaction.

Sarina District Schools Chaplaincy program

The Sarina District Schools Chaplaincy Committee works in collaboration with one high school and seven primary schools, to provide for the care and welfare of approximately 1,700 young people and their families, through the employment of chaplains and the development and implementation of programmes to support those who are facing difficulties.

In 2016 MCF provided \$3,000 to fund 2 programs.

The "Its Your Move" program is a Transition to High School program supporting students moving from Primary Yr.6 into High School Yr.7 from smaller school communities.

The "Managing the dark side of Technology" program supports school communities to empower students, school staff and parents to be aware of, identify, and manage pitfalls and traps in our technology driven world. The program addresses the issues of cyber-bullying, social network misuse, game addiction and the subsequent impacts.

This year the Mackay Community Foundation continued to partner with our supporters to raise much needed funds for our region.

Kalyan Youth Service Inc.

Kalyan provides crisis accommodation for young people who are homeless, or at risk of homelessness. Kalyan also offers transitional housing and all residents are assisted through an individual intensive case management model which is designed to build independent living skills, life, social, and recreational skills.

Kalyan was the successful applicant for the new one-off pilot program with their "Live Well" program, supporting young people aged 16 to 25 years who are homeless, or at risk of homelessness, to live independently and sustainably in stable accommodation. The "Live Well" program builds capacity through building life skills, employment skills, social & recreational skills.

The program aims to provide a flexible and targeted support program for 80 young people that would ensure the individual is: able to attain appropriate accommodation, is transitioned into their accommodation, is capable of the day to day tasks involved in independent living, understands their tenancy, has (or can attain) the necessary household items required to live independently, and is supported for an appropriate length of time to ensure they are able to sustain this accommodation.

MCF has provided \$30,000 in partnership with Kalyan who matched the grant dollar for dollar for the program to operate for a 12 month period so that data and evidence can be collated to enable further funding opportunities.

2016 FRRR Sidney Myer Back to School program

Our 2016 Back to School program was another outstanding success with us bringing \$33,750 into the Mackay business community in the form of 675 x \$50 school stationery and school uniform vouchers distributed to families needing assistance with the costs of getting their children back to school. 35 State primary schools and 10 not-for-profit organisations across the Whitsunday/Isaac/Mackay region received vouchers to distribute.

In bringing this support to our Mackay Community, the Mackay Community Foundation was generously supported by the Foundation for Rural and Regional Renewal, Sidney Myer Foundation, Stan and Maureen Duke Foundation and Dalrymple Bay Coal Terminal. We also acknowledge the great assistance provided by Carroll's Newsagency and Uniform Solutions in delivering the program.

Porters

Most people don't realise just how much this local business gives back to our community. After making significant contributions to the Mackay Community Foundation over the years, Porters invited us to hold our annual grants presentation at Charles Café. It was a great occasion to partner with one of our main supporters and we thank them for their ongoing support.

The program also provides an opportunity to celebrate those who have made a significant contribution to our community in the past by honouring their story. Only 150 people will be honoured. The required donation is \$2,300.

NAMED FUNDS

The Mackay Community Foundation makes it easy for organisations, individuals or families to support community projects in their area by establishing a Named Fund.

A donation is invested with other trust funds but grants made from the donation are acknowledged as being made from the Named Fund. The original donation is never spent, but keeps on giving to the community long after the money or asset was donated.

A Named Fund is ideally suited to an individual, family or business wishing to provide support to a range of charities and community groups in Mackay, leaving an ongoing legacy to the community, or honour a family member, friend or outstanding citizen.

They are an alternative to Private Ancillary Funds (PAF) offering some very real benefits to the donor.

- Funds are referenced and acknowledged in the name specified by the donor. This can be an individual, partners, family names, a business name or in the memory of someone.
- The fund is named from the outset, although the initial minimum contribution can be made over a period of years.*
- The donor can participate in the fund as little or as much as they desire.
- Ongoing contributions, whilst not essential, are recommended at least for a few years.
- Donations to the fund are tax deductible.
- Named fund donors are able to be involved in presenting grants from the fund if they wish.
- The fund continues into perpetuity, even after the donor's passing.

Donors may indicate a preference that a particular group or type of eligible projects benefit from its donation. By establishing a Named Fund with The Mackay Community Foundation donors are ensuring that the local community will receive perpetuity grants from their fund, rather than a once off donation.

We are happy to discuss this or any other options with you, confidentially and totally obligation free.

* The minimum contribution is \$11,500 over three years, and includes a 15% fee for administration.
